### **Course Synopsis**

Monuments are not only an important part of the culture of remembrance, but are also erected for future generations. Nevertheless, they are often destroyed, become victims of wars, vandalism and political upheavals.

While currently statues of colonizers are falling, Contemporary Art in public space is increasingly becoming a soft location factor in city marketing. The noble claim of 'art for all' no longer applies; rather, art functions as an instrument of homogenization and staging in the capitalist interest of the ruling growth coalition.

Against this background, we want to look into the context of urban development/new urbanity, activism within the arts, and the function of art institutions. Using the theories of Pierre Bourdieu and Henri Lefebvre, we will investigate what develops new criteria of evaluation, which are then applied to different art projects in order to open up a perspective for the creation of free spaces and thus complement the prevailing paradigm of the city.

#### **Predispositions**

Students who are interested in the links between culture and politics, art's critical role under late-stage capitalism, and its democratic potentials. Students working in all media welcome.
